#### **1. Answer: A)**

The author's comparison of sweatshirts to hunger in one's own kitchen suggests a metaphorical interpretation related to the existential longing for fulfillment in material possessions. Just as hunger in one's own kitchen implies a desire for something readily available and satisfying, the desire for other people's sweatshirts represents a longing for something tangible and seemingly fulfilling. This interpretation aligns with the broader theme of the passage, which delves into the complexities of desire and the pursuit of happiness through material means. The comparison implies that the desire for material possessions, like sweatshirts, often reflects deeper existential longings for comfort, security, and contentment, which individuals may seek to fulfill through external means.

# 2. Answer: C)

The main function of the sentence "The potential eggs vou on: Some sweatshirts really are better than others" is to reinforce the author's perspective. By stating that "some sweatshirts really are better than others," the author emphasizes the validity of the desire for specific sweatshirts and acknowledges that there are indeed differences in quality among them. This statement aligns with the broader theme of the passage, which explores the complexities of desire and longing for material possessions like sweatshirts. By reinforcing the idea that certain sweatshirts superior to others. the author strengthens their argument about the significance of sweatshirt envy and the pursuit of the perfect one. Therefore, option

c) is the correct answer as it accurately captures the function of the sentence within the context of the passage.

#### **3. Answer: A)**

In this statement, the author is expressing the irony of the situation where despite the abundance and accessibility of sweatshirts, people still find it difficult to satisfy their desire for the perfect one. The phrase "relative scratchability of this itch" implies that the desire for the perfect sweatshirt should theoretically be easy to fulfill, given the wide availability of sweatshirts and the simplicity of the garment itself. However, the author suggests that even though there are plenty of sweatshirts to choose from, people still struggle to find one that completely satisfies their desires. This highlights the discrepancy between the perceived simplicity of the problem (finding a sweatshirt) and the difficulty in finding a solution, emphasizing the triviality or "silliness" of the situation. Therefore, option a) is the correct answer as the author's captures implication regarding the availability of sweatshirts and the difficulty in satisfying the desire for the perfect one.

# 4. Answer: C)

The author employs irony in discussing the desire for other people's sweatshirts by portraying the sweatshirt, a simple garment, as a symbol of complex human desires. Irony arises from the contrast between the seemingly mundane object of desire (the sweatshirt) and the deeper, more profound longings it represents for individuals. By elevating the significance of the sweatshirt beyond its physical attributes, the author highlights the irony in coveting such a commonplace item as a means of fulfilling deeper emotional or psychological needs.

This irony underscores the complexity of human desires and challenges conventional notions of what constitutes true fulfillment or satisfaction.

#### 5. Answer: D)

The author uses the sweatshirt as a symbol to critique American culture by challenging the notion of material possessions as markers of success. Throughout the passage, the author discusses the desire for other people's sweatshirts as existential manifestation of deeper longings, rather than a reflection of genuine fulfillment or contentment. By doing so, the author implies that the pursuit of material possessions, such as the perfect sweatshirt, may not lead to true happiness satisfaction. This critique challenges the prevalent societal belief that material wealth and possessions equate to success or fulfillment, thereby offering a broader American commentary on consumer culture and its values.

#### **6.** Answer: **D**)

The author primarily employs anecdotal evidence to engage readers with the topic of sweatshirt envy. Throughout the passage, the author shares personal observations and experiences related to sweatshirt envy, such as the comparison to David Lynch's perspective on clothing and the mention of Crystal and Alicia's lack of desire for other people's sweatshirts. By incorporating these anecdotes, the author makes the discussion relatable and accessible to readers, allowing them to connect with the topic on a personal level. Anecdotal evidence often appeals to readers' emotions and experiences, making it an effective rhetorical strategy for engaging them in the discussion of complex and abstract concepts like desire and fulfillment. While logical reasoning,

emotional appeal, and ethical appeal may also be present in the passage, anecdotal evidence is the primary rhetorical strategy used to draw readers into the topic of sweatshirt envy.

#### **7. Answer: B)**

In the passage, the term "frame of the conversation" refers to the mental context or focus of the ongoing discussion. It pertains to the perspective or mindset within which the interaction is taking place, influencing the participants' understanding and interpretation of the dialogue. This interpretation is supported by the speaker's consideration of the woman's possible intentions and motivations based on her behavior and responses.

#### 8. Answer: B)

In the passage, the speaker's statement "The pause is my queue" suggests that the pause in the conversation serves as a signal or cue for the speaker to continue speaking. The speaker recognizes the pause as an indication that it is now his turn to contribute to the dialogue, prompting him to advance the conversation further. This interpretation aligns with the speaker's awareness of conversational dynamics and his readiness to participate in the exchange of dialogue.

#### 9. Answer: D)

Throughout the passage, the narrator demonstrates characteristics such as being inquisitive, as seen in his analysis of the woman's behavior and his questioning about her actions. He also exhibits introspective qualities, reflecting on his own thoughts and reactions during the conversation. Additionally, the narrator shows methodological tendencies

applying principles of cooperative discourse to interpret the interaction.

However, the term "vexxed" does not align with the observed behavior of the narrator in the passage. There is no indication that the narrator is particularly agitated or annoyed; instead, he appears to approach the conversation with a rational and analytical mindset. Therefore, "vexxed" is not a characteristic of the narrator as portrayed in the passage.

#### **10.** Answer: C)

The passage primarily delves into the inner thoughts and perceptions of the narrator, indicating introspective an style. Additionally, the structure of the passage is fragmented, as it presents disjointed thoughts and observations rather than following a linear chronological or sequence of events. This fragmentation mirrors the speaker's stream of consciousness and enhances the introspective nature of the Therefore, option c is the most fitting description of the writing style structure of the passage.

#### **11. Answer: C**)

The speaker expresses disdain for "coordinate openings" because they falsely imply that the conversation is continuing in a cooperative manner, when in reality, the speaker finds them to be insincere and misleading. This suggests that such openings create false implications about conversation continuity, as indicated in option c.

#### **12. Answer: B**)

The speaker's deliberation on the significance of asking a simple question like "hello" suggests a critique of the superficiality inherent in adhering to social

norms and linguistic conventions. The passage highlights the pressure individuals may feel to conform to conventional scripts in social interactions, which can often lack genuine meaning or depth. This broader theme is reflected in option b.

#### **13. Answer: C**)

In the context of the passage, "intermittent" is used to describe the academic and artistic output produced by the author during their Integrated Master's program. The term suggests that the output was not continuous or consistent but rather occurred occasionally and irregularly. This aligns with the author's reflection on the sparse nature of their academic and artistic output during the long five years of the program. Therefore, option c) best defines the term "intermittent" as used in the passage.

#### **14. Answer: D**)

The author's reference to "a vicious cut between theory, philosophy, texts, life skills and ways of living" implies a disruption or severance in the continuity coherence of the educational experience. This phrase suggests that the reduction of the Integrated Masters program results in a fragmentation of knowledge and learning experiences. Instead of a holistic integration of various academic disciplines and life skills, there is disjointed and disconnected approach to education. This fragmentation indicates a lack of coherence in the eurriculum, where diverse subjects and aspects of learning are no longer seamlessly integrated. Therefore, option (d) is the most appropriate interpretation of the author's reference.

#### **15.** Answer: **A**)

The author's disappointment regarding the reduction of the Integrated Masters program suggests a broader critique of the commodification of education. By expressing unhappiness over the change and emphasizing the value comprehensive humanities education, the author implicitly critiques the tendency to prioritize economic utility and vocational training over the pursuit of knowledge and intellectual development. This critique aligns with concerns about the commercialization of education, where educational institutions may prioritize profitability and market demands over academic excellence and intellectual inquiry. Therefore, option (a) is the most appropriate inference from the passage.

#### **16.** Answer: **B**)

The passage predominantly conveys a tone of disappointment and criticism. The author expresses unhappiness and heartbreak over the reduction of the Integrated Masters program at IIT Madras from five years to two. They reflect on the value of the humanities education offered by program and express regret over its discontinuation, suggesting a critical perspective on the decision and the state of humanities education in the country. The tone is disheartened as the author laments the loss of opportunities and the diminishing value of comprehensive humanities education.

The sentence "It took me forever to complete the course" does not contribute significantly to the overarching argument presented in the passage. It simply mentions the duration of the course without elaborating on any challenges or

implications. It only serves as an anecdotal marker.

Option a) is incorrect because the sentence does not provide evidence of the author's perseverance or any specific challenges faced during the course.

Option b) is incorrect because the idea of needing a longer and more holistic humanities course is reinforced by subsequent sentences in the passage, rather than by the quoted sentence.

Option c) is incorrect because there is no indication in the sentence that the author is expressing impatience with the educational system. The sentence solely refers to the duration of the course without any emotional or critical context.

Horace Greeley's statement about the unfavorable conditions in Washington, DC, during the 1800s. Then, the speaker presents a contrasting viewpoint by stating, "While some would argue that the first two sentences still apply." This statement implies that despite the passage of time, certain individuals believe that the negative conditions described by Greeley are still relevant or applicable today.

The use of irony in this sentence is evident because it conveys a subtle contradiction or incongruity. On one hand, Greeley's statement was made in the past and reflects the conditions of a bygone era. On the other hand, the suggestion that these conditions still apply today is unexpected or contrary to what one might logically assume. Therefore, the statement employs irony to highlight the discrepancy between past and present perceptions of Washington, DC's conditions.

Distributive justice is a philosophical concept concerned with the fair allocation of resources in society. It posits that goods and resources should be distributed equitably among members of society, taking into account factors such as need, merit, and equality. The author suggests that land ownership allows some individuals to profit from controlling access to a resource that should be shared by all members of society. This aligns with the principle of distributive justice, which emphasizes the fair distribution resources to ensure social and economic equality.

While other philosophical concepts like utilitarianism, social contract theory, and virtue ethics may touch upon aspects of the author's argument, distributive justice best encapsulates the underlying moral concern regarding the equitable distribution of land and its implications for society.

#### **21.** Answer: A)

The author's reference to Mark Twain's purported quote, "they're not making any more of it," serves to highlight the transient nature of land ownership. This quote underscores the finite nature of land as a resource, implying that once land is claimed or developed, it cannot be replenished or created anew. By invoking this quote, the author emphasizes the idea that land is a limited irreplaceable and resource. contrasting with the notion of perpetual land ownership often assumed in property rights. This aligns with the broader argument in the passage that the concept of

land ownership is fundamentally flawed due to its implications for inequality and exploitation, particularly in the context of finite resources. Therefore, option a) best captures the purpose of the reference to Mark Twain's quote.

### **22.** Answer: **D**)

The author's main argument against the concept of land ownership as a natural right is rooted in the idea that the right to physical space is derived from the more fundamental right to live. The passage explains that living requires physical space for the body to occupy, and therefore, the right to life is contingent upon the ability to acquire the basic prerequisite of physical space. The author suggests that the right to space is a derivative of the right to live, emphasizing the fundamental importance of physical occupancy for human existence.

Option a) is incorrect because while the scarcity of habitable land is mentioned in the passage, it is not the author's primary argument against the concept of land ownership.

Option b) is incorrect because while the author discusses how land monopolization perpetuates inequality and exploitation, it is not the main argument against the concept of land ownership as a natural right.

Option c) is incorrect because while the passage acknowledges the unjust historical origins of land acquisition, it is not the main argument presented by the author against the concept of land ownership as a natural right.

#### **23.** Answer: **C**)

The passage argues that the concept of land ownership perpetuates an unjust system in which individuals profit from gatekeeping a finite resource. The author contends that

everyone is born with an existential debt, as they inhabit spaces that belong to others, ownership and land allows individuals to profit by controlling access to this essential resource. By describing land immoral rent-seeking ownership as behavior, the passage suggests that it perpetuates inequality and exploitation rather than upholding a natural right.

Option a) is incorrect because the passage challenges the notion of land ownership as a natural right and instead critiques its ethical implications.

Option b) is incorrect because the passage does not suggest that profiting from land ownership is morally justifiable due to historical precedents. Instead, it critiques the historical origins of land acquisition and emphasizes its unjust nature.

Option d) is incorrect because while the passage discusses the scarcity of land, it does not argue for stringent regulations on property ownership as the primary solution to address this issue.

#### **24.** Answer: C)

The author discusses Horace Greeley's famous statement "Go West, young man, go West" to illustrate the historic belief in the availability of unclaimed land for settlement during the 19th century. This encapsulates the statement popular sentiment of the time, which encouraged individuals to move westward in search of new opportunities and land to claim. By referencing this quote, the author highlights the prevailing attitude that there was always more land available for settlement and expansion, contributing to the myth of the American frontier and the belief in endless territorial expansion.

Option a) is incorrect because the author does not primarily aim to highlight Western expansionism, but rather the belief in the availability of unclaimed land.

Option b) is incorrect because while the discussion of Greeley's statement indirectly touches on the moral implications of land acquisition, it is not the primary purpose of mentioning the quote.

Option d) is incorrect because the author does not directly critique the unethical practices of land acquisition promoted by Greeley, but rather uses his statement to illustrate a broader historical belief.

# **Legal Reasoning**

#### Q53. D

The passage establishes that for an act to be considered a nuisance, it must be prima facie wrongful, create actual damage, and the interference must be unreasonable. Emily's situation fits these criteria as David's loud outdoor events disrupt her peace and impact her ability to rest and focus on tasks. The passage emphasises that the interference causing injury to comfort or health is actionable as a nuisance. Since Emily has faced persistent disruptions affecting her well-being, she has grounds for a nuisance lawsuit against David.

Options A, B, and C are incorrect for the following reasons:

- A. Hosting events with loud speakers is not automatically deemed a reasonable use of property if it results in unreasonable interference and harm to a neighbour.
- B. The ongoing disturbance causing tangible damage to Emily's health and daily life aligns with the criteria for a nuisance, making this option incorrect.
- C. The passage does not provide any indication that the duration of the activity makes it permissible. Instead, it emphasises the requirement of ongoing unreasonable interference causing harm.

#### Q54. A

The passage establishes that for an act to be considered a nuisance, there must be unreasonable interference with a person's use or amusement of land or rights over land, causing actual damage. Liam's situation aligns with this criterion as the arcade's excessive noise and disruption interfere unreasonably with his property, causing discomfort and harm to his business. The passage indicates that injury to comfort or health is actionable as a nuisance, supporting Liam's legal action. Options B, C, and D are incorrect for the following reasons:

- B. The right to operate a business does not extend to unreasonably interfering with neighbouring establishments, causing harm, as emphasised in the passage.
- C. Liam's legal action is justified based on the unreasonable interference causing discomfort and harm, not merely due to the disturbance of an average person.
- D. Legal authorization for the arcade's location doesn't exempt it from liability if it unreasonably interferes with neighbouring properties, as established by the criteria for nuisance in the passage.

# Q55. C

The passage indicates that Olivia is pursuing a nuisance lawsuit against her neighbours due to the disruptive noise and activity caused by the music school. The likely remedy mentioned is an injunction, which is a court order instructing the neighbours to take specific actions to alleviate the disturbance. This may include limiting the student count, reducing noise levels, and implementing measures to minimise the impact on the neighbourhood. Additionally, potential monetary damages may be awarded to compensate Olivia for the harm caused.

Options A, B, and D are incorrect for the following reasons:

- emphasises

  A. The passage mentions potential remedies beyond monetary compensation, such as injunctions, making this option incomplete.
  - B. An abatement order, mentioned in the passage, is similar to an injunction and is a more likely remedy than self-regulation without court involvement.
  - D. Relocating the music school to a commercial area is not mentioned in the passage as a potential remedy, and it doesn't align with typical nuisance lawsuit outcomes.

#### **Q56.** B

The passage indicates that Jake is facing ongoing and unreasonable interference from the Andersons, including noisy latenight activities, parking on his property, and a disruptive parrot. This aligns with the criteria for nuisance as it causes discomfort to an average person, impacting Jake's peace and well-being. The passage does not any legal authorization mention prescription that would iustify the Andersons' actions. Therefore, Jake has grounds to succeed in a nuisance case.

Options A, C, and D are incorrect for the following reasons:

A. is incorrect because the passage does not suggesting that information provide prescription, which typically requires engaging in the disruptive activities for a specified duration (e.g., 20 years), applies to the Andersons. The passage does not mention the duration of their disruptive behaviour, making it unlikely prescription is a valid defence for the Andersons.

- C. The passage does not portray the Andersons' actions as reasonable interference, and managing animals being challenging does not justify inconsiderate conduct.
- D. While potential outcomes such as damages are mentioned, the passage doesn't explicitly state the consequences, making NISIU Studen this option speculative.

#### Q57. A

The passage highlights that the recycling facility is causing persistent noise and pollution, severely disrupting Raj's sleep and impacting his family's health. This aligns with the criteria for nuisance as it involves unreasonable interference with Raj's rights, causing discomfort and harm. The passage does not mention the duration of Raj's residency as a factor affecting his claim, making Option B invalid.

Option C refers to public nuisance, being severely punished by the IPC which is not mentioned in the passage.

Option D is incorrect as the right of prescription is only in case of private nuisance and not public nuisance.

#### **Q58.** A

The passage establishes that the doctrine of frustration applies when the actual subjectmatter of the contract ceases to exist, such as in the case of a party's death. Sophia's demise renders the agreement impossible to perform, falling under the principle of frustration, making the contract null and

- B. The passage does not indicate any obligation for Sophia's heir to transfer the promised 20% of the art collection to Emily. The doctrine of frustration, in this context, revolves around the impossibility of performance due to Sophia's death.
- C. The passage does not mention the dedication or commitment of Emily as factors that would affect the application of the doctrine of frustration in this scenario.
- D. While it mentions the absence of assistance, the primary reason for the nullification of the contract is Sophia's demise, not the discontinuation assistance by Emily.

#### **Q59.** B

The passage does not explicitly mention the scenario described, but it establishes the general principle that an agreement to do an act that is impossible from the very beginning, such as the performance of the contract after the irreparable damage to the chosen painting, renders the contract void. Since the chosen painting is damaged beyond repair, the contract becomes void, and David is not obligated to provide an alternative painting.

Options A, C, and D are incorrect for the following reasons:

A. The passage does not mention any established contract or payment being made, and the impossibility arising from the damage makes the contract void.

C. The passage does not support the idea that it is at David's discretion; instead, it suggests that the void nature of the contract is due to the impossibility of performance.

D. The passage does not attribute the damage to David's negligence, and the focus is on the general principle of voiding a contract due to impossibility.

#### Q60. C

The passage implies that the primary reason for the nullity of the agreement is its inherent impossibility – the inability to make a plant communicate. While Emily's status as a minor is not explicitly discussed, the emphasis is on the impossibility of the task, rendering the agreement null and void. Therefore, the correct option is C, focusing on the contractual impossibility rather than Emily's minority status.

Options A, B, and D are incorrect for the following reasons:

A. While Emily is a minor, the passage does not explicitly address her legal recourse due to minority; instead, it highlights the impossibility of the agreement.

B. The passage does not suggest a breach of agreement; rather, it underscores the impossibility of fulfilling the promise made by Jason.

D. The passage does not explicitly state that a valid contract between a father and a daughter regarding a plant is impossible; the primary issue is the impossibility of the task itself.

The passage describes a contract between Sarah and Mark for cooking lessons, and Mark faces an unexpected injury during the second week, disrupting the lessons. The agreement's frustration due to Mark's injury doesn't automatically void the contract. Instead, Mark assures Sarah that he will make up for the missed classes. The focus is on the breach of contractual obligations and the delay caused by Mark's injury. Therefore, Sarah has grounds to take legal action against Mark for his failure to fulfil the contractual obligations in a timely manner.

Options A, B, and D are incorrect for the following reasons:

A. The contract is not automatically void due to Mark's injury; the passage emphasises Mark's responsibility to make up for the missed classes.

B. While Sarah may be concerned about the cooking competition, the passage does not explicitly state that Mark's breach put her at risk of performing poorly.

D. Mark committing to making up for missed classes in the future does not absolve him of accountability for the breach; Sarah still has the right to take legal action for the delay.

#### Q62. C

The passage does not provide information about a court determining the applicability of the law of frustration based on the acknowledgment of the parties regarding the primary purpose of the agreement. The passage outlines general principles about the voidability of agreements involving impossible acts, the application of the rule of frustration to unsuccessful original intents, and the broad scope of contracts subject to the notion of frustration. Therefore, Option C cannot be concluded from the passage.

Options A, B, and D are incorrect for the following reasons:

- A. The passage explicitly states that whether the parties were aware of the impossibility or not, an agreement to perform an act that is impossible from the start will be void.
- B. The passage discusses the rule of frustration applying not only to logical impossibilities but also to cases where the original intent of the parties fails.
- D. The passage mentions the impossibility of establishing a clear list of situations in which frustration applies, supporting the idea that a wide range of contracts are subject to this notion.

# Q63. C

The passage introduces the defence of insanity, emphasising that it is based on the accused being in a state of mind where they did not know the nature and qualities of the act or did not know that what they were doing was wrong. In Rachel's case, her hallucinations, driven by fear and the substance use, influence of potentially align with the criteria for the defence of insanity, as she genuinely believed in the presence of a threatening figure resembling her abusive family member.

Options A, B, and D are incorrect for the following reasons:

- A. The defence of insanity is not explicitly linked to substances impairing cognitive functions; it focuses on the accused's state of mind regarding the nature of the act.
- B. The defence of insanity is not solely about diminished mental capacity; it also involves the accused's knowledge and perception of the act.
- D. The passage does not definitively state that the defence of insanity may not be applicable due to substance use; it emphasises the need to establish the accused's state of mind at the time of the act.

#### Q64. B

The passage describes Alex's actions as motivated by the intention to clean his child after an accidental fall into a muddy pond. There is no indication of malicious intent or awareness of potential harm. The tragic outcome appears to be an unintended consequence of his attempt to clean the child. Therefore, option B is correct as it aligns with the scenario presented in the passage.

Options A, C, and D are incorrect for the following reasons:

- A. The passage does not suggest awareness of potential consequences; rather, it portrays the actions as unintentional and driven by the desire to clean the child.
- C. The answer emphasises the presence of evidence regarding an intention to harm, however, none is mentioned in the question making it challenging to establish liability. D. There is no mention of potential insanity in the passage, and the scenario is presented as an unintended consequence of Alex's actions. The passage does not provide grounds for claiming insanity as a defence.

#### Q65. C

The passage does not provide evidence that Professor Michelle's personal opinion or self-awareness should determine her claim of insanity. The emphasis is on her engaging in unusual behaviour, leading to concerns and the commission of a grievous act. Option C aligns with the principle that the court, not the individual, should impartially assess and decide on the mental condition in legal proceedings.

Options A, B, and D are incorrect for the following reasons:

- A. The passage does not provide information on whether Professor Michelle lacks self-awareness; it focuses on her engaging in unusual behaviour and committing a grievous act.
- B. While Professor Michelle has a successful career in psychology, the passage does not suggest that her expertise should automatically validate her claim of insanity.

D. The passage mentions the violent act but does not explicitly state that it indicates potential insanity; it presents the act as a reason for seeking legal intervention.

#### Q66. A

The passage mentions that Vikram sought guidance, made a decision during a live art exhibition, and faced charges related to the incident. There is no indication that Vikram lacked awareness of his actions; rather, he attributes them to Guru Ananya's influence and his desire for artistic acclaim. Option A aligns with the presented information, suggesting that Vikram's actions were driven by his beliefs and goals, and an insanity defence is unlikely.

Options B, C, and D are incorrect for the following reasons:

- B. While Vikram adhered to Guru Ananya's guidance, the passage does not provide evidence of potential mental instability or lack of awareness.
- C. The passage does not explicitly mention a need for a thorough examination of Vikram's comprehension of his actions; it focuses on the influence of Guru Ananya.

Vikram's pursuit of acclaim and the decision to harm someone while not independent of Guru Anirudh's influence, still showed him exercising his mental faculties.
